5. Citizen's recognition-

- a. Peter Girardeau, Planner with Hill Studio presented drawings and plans for a Center for the Trades located across from Town Hall and plans for a conference center within Town Hall.
- b. Sharon Fisher with The Clinch Coalition asks for Council to ask DEQ to inspect the back side of Stone Mountain Trail and work through the 16 documented violations in their joint agreement with Spearhead. Virginia Marine Resources Commission has had no permit requests from Southwest Regional Recreation Authority. A bridge over the Powell was installed without a permit. Dave Skinner reported the US Forestry Service has been notified by SRRA that they will not be helping with Cave Springs Recreation Area. Phil Shelton, retired UVA-Wise professor simply reminded the oath, "do no harm", as many trails lead through streams and wetlands and are unpermitted. Suggested a read of A Sand County Almanac in which Aldo Leopold urges to preserve integrity, stability and beauty of a biotic community.

10. Projects

- a. Sidewalk Safety to hospital-Cecil Street issues on sidewalk will be taken care of with a covered culvert, working with Lane Engineering on the design and VDOT, Elk Knob pricing the job. We will need to move water lines. Job will take us a day of work.
- b. ARC Business Center / Conference Center-Keith presented drawings for the proposed trade and conference centers.
- c. Industrial Revitalization Fund Planning Grant A grant application for \$100k was awarded at \$50k for planning. IRF grant for infrastructure to prepare to "white box" requires 50% match up to \$600k. Two IRF grants available, one through ARPA is up to \$500 million at 100%. Keith has asked Hill Studio to assure the planning grant meets all requirements for both. Study and shovel ready at application. Terry Pope made a Motion to transfer \$25k from ARPA funding for study. Jill Carson seconded the Motion. Roll call vote as follows:

- d. Historic designation-no update
- e. Wastewater Treatment Plant Repair Grant-Brian Skidmore is getting updated costs from 2019 estimate. A completed audit is required for final report. May 16 should be completed audit date.
- f. Water Treatment Plant Structural Repair-RFP is being redone for current pricing.

Keith also added that Scouts in the River is Saturday, 23rd April at 8 am and a TVA grant was awarded in the amount of \$1500 for the event. Little League kicks off on Friday, April 22nd with a 7 pm parade in the park. 223 kids have signed up this year. The town will show

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Sandlot on the big screen at dark. Games are all day Saturday. We need a new league field in the park and he has spoke with C.D. and Scott Litton on the groundwork.

Terry Pope-Parks & Recreation Director interviews completed. Would like to partner with Lee County on the position since several children from the county are served and the county is building a basketball court in Western Lee. He also needs some monetary incentives for expanding a business and jointly meet with boards, EDA, IDA. Gas & Go is example of positive results in doing so.

§ 2.2-3711(A)(3): Acquisition & disposition of property. Provides an exemption for: Discussion or consideration of the acquisition of real property for a public purpose, or of the disposition of publicly held real property, where discussion in an open meeting would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the public body.

Virginia Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(5) Discussion concerning a prospective business or industry or the expansion of an existing business or industry where no previous announcement has been made of the business' or industry's interest in locating or expanding its facilities in the community.

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Virginia Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(7) Consultation with legal counsel and briefings by staff members or consultants pertaining to actual or probable litigation, where such consultation or briefing in open meeting would adversely affect the negotiating or litigating posture of the public body; and consultation with legal counsel employed or retained by a public body regarding specific legal matters requiring the provision of legal advice by such counsel.
